Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. Dating Back to 1865, it was on June 19th that Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed in Galveston, Texas with the news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. This was two and one-half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, which had become official on January 1, 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union Troops to enforce the new executive order. With the surrender of General Lee in April 1865 and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance. This day is celebrated

by African-Americans in honor of their ancestors.



Obama, who draws rock star-type crowds into the thousands, has said little about alleged threats since Sen. "Use the \$3 billion surplus to ensure a strong future for our state," Nagin urged state lawmakers. "As New Orleans recovers, so does Louisiana."

The speech comes just two days before the start of a new hurricane season, and against the backdrop of a city still fighting to recover from a storm 21 months ago.

While more than half the city's pre-Katrina population is back, according to one recent estimate, swaths of some neighborhoods remain in shambles, with houses empty and many small businesses ailing or shuttered.

Violent crime, including a rash of recent killings that has brought the city's murder total for the year to at least 78, is a worry. And progress so far has been largely driven by private efforts, as local, state and federal officials have traded blame over the slow pace of rebuilding.

As of mid-month, the city said it had received just \$163 million in federal rebuilding aid, a fraction of the \$1 billion or more it says it will need just to restore what Katrina damaged and with little earmarked for permanent infrastructure work.Nagin named a recovery director

Then each of you will control your body and live in holiness and honor – not in lustful passion as the pagans do, in their ignorance of God and his ways" (I Thessalonians 4:3-4:5) God also says: "Run away from sexual sin! No - Why not, I'm free to do what I want. I have nothing to other sin so clearly affects the body as this one does. For sexual immorality is a sin against your own body. Or don't **ANSWER:** Really? Let's see: (1) The girl may be pregnant you know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit,

YOUNG PEOPLE are get a sexual disease. (3) You lose your self-esteem. (4) You belong to yourself, for God bought you with a high price.

### - I don't know how to say "no" to a guy.

**ANSWER:** It's easy when you say "no" before you go out on a date. Share up-front your standards BEFORE you go out with him, then no one will be "ticked off" later. You can also plan fun dates with other couples that share your moral values. AND, you can pay your own way sometimes. I know one father who ALWAYS pays for his daughter's share on a date...whether it's the movies with a guy or prom night with dinner, corsage, and pictures...He pays for his daughter's share. Because, says this Dad, he doesn't want the guy thinking his daughter owes him ANYTHING at the end of the evening.

## - I have lost my virginity already anyway...I can't get that

**ANSWER:** Yes you can! Your virginity can be restored, even after a child is born. When you ask for AND RECEIVE forgiveness from God, then you are a brand new person...You can begin a new life. There are examples in the Bible where God did just that. Don't allow Satan to deceive you with that line...so he can keep you wallowing in sin. Nothing is so bad that God will not forgive. Jesus already died for your sins. He knew which sins you were going to commit and he died, instead of you, for them. Isn't he wonderful. (See John 8:1-11 and Joel 2:25)

### – I don't know how to act on a date?

**ANSWER:** Act like Jesus is sitting in the car with you...in the theater with you...on the sofa with you. Two things will happen: You will not arouse or tease the guy sexually, and he will show respect for you.
